To this end, your new board has been working hard since June to map out a schedule of trips and events that will hopefully be attractive to a whole bunch of folks. We talked to a fair few people, both current and ex-members, to elicit opinions on how we should operate. And now we're ready to make those changes happen.

By far the busiest board member so far has been your Wagon Master, Jamie. Based on a few principles we discussed, Jamie has put together trip schedule that should cater to all tastes. Here's how we got to this schedule.

- 1) We want full, fun trips. We definitely don't want to cancel any. Therefore we decided to go for just 4 trips, with a variety of local and slightly further away destinations. All these trips offer excellent terrain and accommodation, and are good value. I hope you'll all agree.
- 2) To expand the selection of trips, we worked with Hawk's Flock to try and avoid trip and destination overlap. Many DSC members go on these trips, and in a relatively small market like the Tri-Cities, strength is much more likely to be found in collaboration rather than conflict. So we'll be helping Hawk's Flock promote and sell trips, and the club and many DSC members will benefit from this cooperation.
- 3) To keep trip costs as low as possible, and recognizing that different people like to indulge on bus trips a little differently, all DSC trips will now be BYOB. On recent trips I've been on, a lot of people have been BYOB-ing anyway, and this measure helps reduce costs for everyone and simplify logistics for trip leaders. And hey, you get to drink what you like!

In September, we'll be holding our first meeting of the year at the Shilo in Richland. It'll be pretty low key, but we'll start selling trips and signing up members, so I hope some of you can come along, share stories of summer and plans for winter, and collectively we can start returning this club to the vibrant, exciting and eclectic organization it was when I first joined in 2001. Being members of the club introduced Jan and me to some great people, took us on some truly wonderful ski trips, and completely enhanced our enjoyment of skiing. Those benefits persist for us, and hopefully will do for many more of you, and people we don't know, in the coming year.

Just remember, it's all about the skiing, or boarding, or if you're really weird, free-heeling :)

Your place on a ski trip is confirmed in order of final payment which meets the due dates. Refunds are made to the person who paid the Ski Club for the trip.

February 13-15, 2009

For our family trip this year, we're going to the 49 Degrees North ski resort located north of Spokane. And this time, we'll be staying in Colville instead of our usual stop in Chewelah. Unfortunately, as many of you know, the lodging in Chewelah is limited and leaves quite a bit to be desired. So we're going to drive a few more miles up the road and stay at the Comfort Inn in Colville. It's a nice, newer motel and they've been very accommodating.

49 Degrees was recently rated the "The #1 Most Family-Friendly Resort in the Pacific Northwest". With a vertical drop of 1900 feet and 2325 skiable acres, it offers great skiing for everyone. And they offer great group discounts, making the trip affordable for more people. That's our kind of place!

The plan is to leave from the Tri-Cities Friday, February 13th and drive to Colville. We'll stay in the Comfort Inn Friday and Saturday nights and ski 49 Degrees Saturday and Sunday. After skiing Sunday, we'll board the bus and head back to the Tri-Cities, with a stop along the way for dinner. Monday, February 16th is a holiday (President's Day), giving a lot of you an extra day to recover before going back to school or work. Considering that 49 Degrees doesn't get the typical holiday crowds and that they and the motel both gave us a great discount for the holiday weekend, we figured this was the best place for us to ski on this prime-time February weekend!

We've brought back an old standard of the DSC with a new twist! We're head to Mt Hood in Oregon for 3 days of skiing. But this time we've added the option of skiing at 3 different ski areas and we're staying on the mountain, in the village of Government Camp. No more long bus rides between the hotel and the slopes and you can walk back and forth from one ski resort if you want!

Here's the plan. We'll leave early morning Friday, February 20th and travel to Mt Hood for a day of skiing at the Ski Bowl Resort. Ski Bowl offers 65 ski runs on 1000 acres of terrain, with some really nice glade skiing. It's also America's largest night skiing area. Ski Bowl is located in Government Camp and is just across the street from the Mt Hood Inn, where we'll be staying Friday and Saturday nights. After skiing Friday, we'll go across the street, check in at the Inn and rally next door at the Mt Hood Brewing Company's Ice Axe Grill for a DSC Happy Hour reception.

On Saturday, the bus will make a morning run to Ski Bowl, Mt Hood Meadows and Timberline. Your choice, ski any one of those resorts, they're all close by. We'll come back and pick you up at the end of the day and take you back to the Inn (unless you opt for the night skiing at Ski Bowl, in which case you walk back across the street and you're home!). 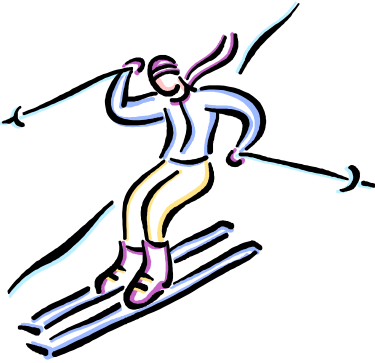
